With its authentic medieval appearance, Bamberg offers many interesting sights, including the Cathedral with the tombs of Emperor Henry II and Pope Clement II; the Old Town Hall, built in the middle of the Regnitz River; Klein-Venedig (*'Little Venice'*), a colony of picturesque fishermen's houses from the 19th century along the river and many more.



Do not forget to try German Rauchbier ('smoked beer'), which is only produced in Bamberg.

Veste Coburg

The Veste Coburg was first mentioned in 1056. Not only because of its dominating location, but also due to its beauty as well as its mighty structure, it is also called *'the Franconian Crown'*. It is one of the biggest and best preserved castles in Germany, being home of several internationally-acclaimed art collections, such as precious Venetian glass, historic weapons, the worldwide oldest carriages and baroque sledges and famous oeuvres of Old German art works.
