Bratwurstmuseum Holzhausen

In the 1st German Bratwurst Museum, the focus is on the mix of pork, salt, pepper, caraway, marjoram and garlic in its fine casing. The first mention of bratwurst in records was in Thuringia in 1404 and the historic context is shown on a wooden relief. Numerous other exhibits provide a wealth of information associated with the bratwurst, from the pig through slaughter to appliances and machines used in sausage production.



Senfmühle Kleinhettstedt

The mustard mill was first mentioned in the 15th century, but some remains of old walls suggest that it was even 200 years older. You will learn about the traditional way of producing mustard. Unlike for the industrial production, the traditional method does not produce as much heat, which preserves more of the mustard oil and its spiciness. By adding spices and herbs, a variety of 19 variants of mustard is created at this mustard mill. What a great number!
